- There are six Volunteer Student Teachers in school at the moment: German x 4 and French x 2 (the French students are leaving in May. The German students are here from April 1 until June 30)

- Open morning for prospective Junior Infants: May 18, 10:30-11:15 am
- Current enrolment: 115
- Five mainstream teachers; three SET; 15.5 cluster SET hours from three visiting teachers; 7.5 EAL hours; four SNAs - one f/t, two P/T, one infant day. Recently granted 7.5 hours of extra SET. Róisín Brett will be the teacher covering the 7.5 EAL and 7.5 SET hours. This will be three full days per week.

 This will come out of PAC funds.
- PDST Physical Literacy Seminar 5 Killian will attend as well as one other teacher with the Department providing substitute cover where required.

 Framework Webinars/CPD = one day closure on Friday, June
 2 to allow staff to engage with the curricular developments.
- Polytunnel site has been established and polytunnel is in process of being ordered
- Standardised tests to be done WEEK BEGINNING May 22
- Successful planned fire drill held April 18. Surprise one
