New School Update from Edwin Scally, Architect, as of 26/9/2023

Please see the images attached. The building design is complete. The various Ecological and Environmental Reports have been received. They took a long time to complete as they had to look at all aspects of the development including at both construction and operational stages and how it affects the natural habitats of the Inagh SAC and and the nature of the wildlife on site including plant life, bats, birds, habitats, etc. We expect the Stage 2a report to be issued to the Dept. in November. In terms of high level programme we would expect the building to be opened in 2026.
